You're bringing LIFE into public schools

Thrive's new STD education program gains access to Dallas-area school districts



C Take your piece of gum and chew it," said Vivian Summey, Thrive Nurse and OhKnow Educator, talking to a couple of 8th grade volunteers she brought to stand in front of their health class at Frasier Middle School in Mesquite.

"Now, take it out of your mouth and trade with your neighbor," she said. "Chew your neighbor's gum."

"Whoa!" they chimed in disgust. "Ew! I'm not doing that."

Summey chuckled and explained. "You're saying you're not going to chew this gum, yet a large percentage of you will go out and have oral, genital, or other kinds of sex, which are far more dangerous than chewing this gum. So let's walk

through the risks of being sexually active."

This is how Summey gets the attention of the public school students she is teaching about

sexually transmitted diseases (STDs) and sexual health in Dallas-area public schools. Thrive nurses have been teaching a fetal development class since 2010 and added a second class on STD education in 2018. Together, these two class offerings form **OhKnow, Thrive's education program.**

OhKnow is now approved for **Richardson**, **Garland**, and **Mesquite Independent School Districts**. Teachers in those districts can log on to Ohknow.org and schedule a presentation. The classes are also offered with a spiritual emphasis for private schools and church groups.

Already in 2019, **OhKnow nurses taught 24** classes on fetal development and STDs for 2,240 students all over the region. **OhKnow is on track** to more than double the number of presentations this school year.

Why are schoolteachers eager to have Thrive nurses come teach these topics? Middle and high schools are required to teach fetal development and sexual health by the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS), and OhKnow offers to bring in the classes for free.

Dallas has the highest increase in the nation

in cases of **chlamydia and gonorrhea**, according to the Centers for Disease Control. **Syphilis** is alarmingly on the rise all across the nation, and can affect newborns. Antibiotic treatments are proving less and less effective. Additionally, certain Dallas zip codes have the nation's highest teen pregnancy rates in the nation.

"It's definitely an epidemic problem," Summey said. Dallas ISD and the City of Dallas recently approved a "safe sex" education programs backed by Planned Parenthood, despite outcry from many Thrive supporters and others in the community. As an alternative, Thrive believes the **OhKnow:STD presentations, though secular, discourage the risky sexual behavior that is a key part of the life issue**.

"When students understand the consequences"

of risky sexual activity, they will seek healthier relationships that ultimately honor God's plan for sex and family," Summey said. "Partner this with our fetal development program teaching when life begins, and **we can build a generation that will find abortion unthinkable**."

OhKnow:STDs is an interactive multimedia presentation that lasts 30-45 minutes and includes quizzes, statistics, eye-opening photographs, and gripping anecdotes from our nurses' experiences in the pregnancy clinic. Educators teach the statistics of various protection methods but stress sexual purity as the only foolproof way to avoid these consequences.

All the school teachers gave the highest rating on a survey and indicated they want to invite OhKnow back next year. *P*

How does OhKnow get into public schools? The SHAC and YOU

Each Texas school district has a Student Health Advisory Council (SHAC), a group of parents and community members who meet to approve healthrelated education and services for the district, such as OhKnow. Thrive is actively working to earn representation through YOU in other districts, including Dallas ISD.

"The SHACs are a key way to **influence the messages our children are hearing about sex** and health in public schools," said Meredith Hall, Thrive's Director of Clinic Services. "Consider applying for these committees in your own districts to let your voice be heard."

The leadership long-game

Executive Director Mary Jayne Fogerty celebrates 15 years

Thrive is celebrating longevity of leadership as Executive Director Mary Jayne Fogerty marks 15 years of visionary guidance, which is longer than any other director in Thrive's 36-year history.

Fogerty, a graduate of the University of Texas at Austin, joined Thrive in 2004 as Director of Development and was appointed to her current role less than two years later.

"I remember feeling very ill-equipped," Fogerty admits, "but I loved being in urban ministry where I could share the gospel, so I stepped in out of obedience to God."

That has been her mantra ever since: Walk through the doors God opens with faith He will show up in marvelous ways.

Fogerty is quick to embrace opportunities that God presents, whether it's opening new clinics, supporting pregnancy centers in developing countries, or embracing new technology to reach abortion-minded women through their cell phone searches.

She takes every chance to tell about God's work for life in Dallas, whether on a radio show or on the go.

"I was recently at a dinner party in the Hamptons with my husband's work, and I got to tell a woman about what I do," Fogerty said. "She opened up about her own abortion in the past and shared her whole experience. That happens all the time. God has really emboldened me and this has become such a part of my identity."

You sparked

We had no idea Rebecca's story at Thrive started 10 years ago in the sonogram room.

Most staff in the Thrive offices knew Rebecca Ibarra as the modest, godly mom of five who volunteered faithfully every week, quietly organizing our baby store. She small-talked about her family beach vacation, her son's wrestling tournaments, and her church group.



But not many knew she first walked through Thrive's clinic doors 10 years earlier as a client in a spiral of self-destruction.

"That year, 2009, I was raising an 8-year-old and a one-year-old," she recalls. "I was living with a man who was not my husband. When the pregnancy test came back positive, overwhelming anxiety just washed over me. What do I do now?"

She shakes her head to think about how complicated her situation had become over the years.

As a child, she vividly remembers the real spiritual experience of getting baptized at First Baptist Church in Leesville, LA. Her parents got divorced, she joined the military at age 17, had a baby and got married by 18, and eventually worked her way up to well-paying jobs at large companies. When her family stopped going to church, she descended into a dark season.

"I drowned myself with cocaine, alcohol, chain smoking and a party lifestyle. I became the complete opposite of who I knew I should be," she said. "I would go to Planned Parenthood when I needed Plan B contraceptives."

Nobody at Planned Parenthood presented her with options or listened to her story. Luckily this time, she found Thrive through a Google search.

"Thrive was so welcoming, like I was in someone's home," she recalls. "My nurse showed me the sonogram and said I'm 16 weeks pregnant. I saw a squirming baby boy."

She said her advocate's loving approach in the counseling room broke down barriers that allowed her to be open.

"This flood of emotion came out of me," she said. "I had gone through one traumatic event after another. The divorce, drugs, alcohol abuse, and covering up a rape I had suffered. Hiding beneath all that was such a heavy burden."

Her advocate kept reminding her that despite all her decisions that brought so many difficult consequences, Jesus still loved her.

"I felt like this was the beginning of something," Rebecca said. "I look back at that moment, and I can say hope started there. It was like a light you could barely see, but I left the office knowing I could choose life for my son—and for myself."

She accepted the advocate's invitation to attend Watermark Church. God began to work in powerful ways. She married the baby's father, and they built a family.

"We started to break down those walls in our lives with so much sin and started the healing process, she said. "We have five kids now, including the youngest we took in for a relative through guardianship. **Our lives are completely different and that's all because of Jesus. He really can change you."**

He is now using her story as a platform for His glory as she serves as an ambassador for life at churches and various events. Her message?

"Every man, woman and child who has any interaction with Thrive is truly being changed, and an imprint of Christ is being left," Rebecca says. "I'm proof."
