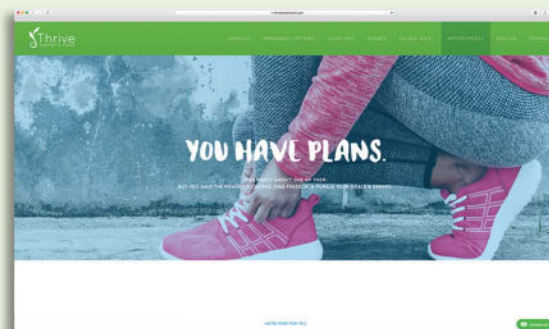
We welcome anyone seeking services. About one-third of our clients are at-risk for abortion.

- Our OhKnow education program doubled its reach. Our nurses taught **3,225** students in local schools about fetal development and sexually transmitted diseases.



Caroline Hunt: A legacy of life

What is life's greatest thrill for Caroline Hunt, the wise and merry-hearted matriarch who will turn 90 years old next month?

"I must admit, it's when I see one of my 26 great-grandchildren running down the hall toward me with arms open saying 'Grandmamal!'" she said. "Jesus told us, 'Let the children come to me. Such is the kingdom of heaven.'"

These are not the only little ones she reaches out to welcome. Through generous financial gifts to Thrive Women's Clinic for decades, she has helped save thousands of babies from abortion, supporting women all over Dallas so they can experience the same thrill of motherhood she enjoys.

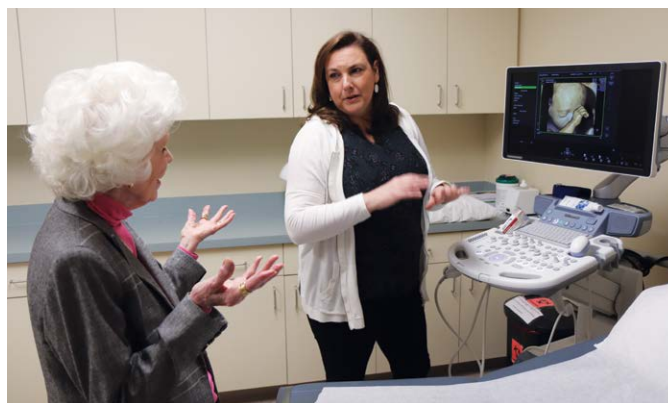
And she is making sure this legacy stays alive. Every generation of her family has become infused with her deep faith in God's view of life. About a dozen of her children and grandchildren have also supported Thrive through generous donations and every kind of volunteer service.

She has also left a legacy through her church, Park Cities Presbyterian Church, a key Thrive partner where she and her husband were founding members. "The sanctity of human life was a basic premise of this church from the start," she said. **"This church believes if God created you and in His image, you're a treasure from the beginning. Why should it be destroyed?"**

Mrs. Hunt even uses her home to treasure children. Smell the cookies she regularly bakes for her brood, step around the toy strollers and Legos she keeps in her living room, and take a closer look at the long lineup of portraits she keeps of every child, grandchild, and great-grandchild—and their spouses. They live out her legacy in a variety of ways.

"I remember Mrs. Hunt's daughter, Ellen Flowers, and her granddaughter, Julia Schwarz, cleaning toilets to help us get ready to open our West Dallas Clinic in 2005," said Mary Jayne Fogerty, Thrive's Executive Director. "That's just one example of the Hunt family's selfless generosity that has blessed our ministry immeasurably. They are an example for us all."

Betsy Hunt said her mother-in-law's life has taught the family how they can tangibly live out their prolife passion. Betsy has supported Thrive and serves on the Council for Life board, which supports many prolife organizations in Dallas. Betsy's children also support Thrive and volunteer. She believes the family's legacy will carry on.



"I have complete confidence in the next generation when I see them get involved and get help to those who need it," Betsy said. "They are wise about giving and are good stewards. There's a lot of hope."

You're saving lives overseas

Thrive Women's Clinic has served women in Dallas County for 36 years and your faithful support has helped this ministry build a strong reputation of excellence in the pregnancy center industry worldwide. That's what led two separate groups to approach us for guidance this year as they launch pregnancy centers overseas. We are excited to equip these ministries for success and continue ongoing partnership with them.

Kampala, Uganda

You supplied Latter Glory Clinic with training materials, 500 pregnancy tests, and connections for a sonogram machine. In July, we sent two Thrive staff to Uganda for a week to train clinic staff, community groups, and churches about fetal development and sexual health.

Update: The clinic is open 24/7 and in October-November saved 27 babies!

2019 Partner Goals: Cover the salaries of the executive director and her assistant, 500 pregnancy tests, dopplers to read fetal heartbeats, and a generator with fuel.

Santiago, Chile



Your support launched the country's first pregnancy center the same year abortion became legal. Founders Juan and Eva (pictured above with a staff member on left), trained under our executive director, modeled their clinic after Thrive, and took home fetal models, 500 pregnancy tests, and more.

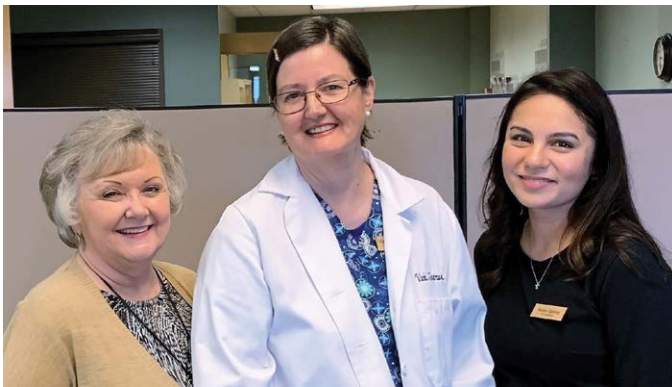
Update: The clinic has been open Fridays since July and in 2018 saved 2 babies!

2019 Partner Goals: Fund rent and resources for a sonogram machine while continuing moral and prayer support.

Valentina, 21, was the first abortion-minded client to choose life at Naceran Foundation. Clinic staff connected her with an amazingly supportive spiritual community that will pay for her manicurist training so she can work from home.

You stepped up and ... Irving has hope!

With your support, our Irving Clinic launched in November, and about 50 clients experiencing unplanned pregnancy heard the Gospel in the first two months, including some considering abortion. Two clients changed their minds and chose life for their babies!

Amanda* came the first day the clinic was open in 2019 considering abortion since she had been laid off over Christmas. She left her appointment undecided but called back later and told us she changed her mind after she couldn't stop thinking about the baby she saw on our sonogram screen. She came back for another sonogram with the baby's father, and they laughed together as they watched their active baby, 12 weeks along. 🌱

Beyond the heart beat

**Your support doesn't stop
in the sonogram room**

Nicole shared the news with her fiancée: The pregnancy test came back positive. His reply text shocked her.

"Is there any way you can take care of this?"

Her body felt a wave of deep disappointment and confusion. She told him she didn't think she could do that—abortion.



"Well, in that case, good luck then," he messaged back. "I don't want to have anything to do with you or this baby."

"And that was that," she said. "He was done. I actually hid it from my family the first two months. I was still in shock."

Nicole, a U.S. Navy veteran, was a student getting her prerequisites for dental hygienist school. She needed a new plan, and a friend

told her about Thrive.

"They gave me a sonogram, and that solidified for me that I could do this," she said.

Like many women who come to Thrive Women's Clinic, that triumphant choice for life in the sonogram room was just the dawn of Nicole's journey. That's why Thrive's services don't stop there. Nicole embarked on a year-long process with Thrive's full package of holistic care, meeting her needs emotionally, financially, and spiritually.

Nicole didn't have an emotional support system in her life until she started meeting regularly with Thrive staff and her volunteer advocate, Betsy Halford.

"Like many women who come to Thrive Women's Clinic, that triumphant choice for life in the sonogram room was just the dawn of Nicole's journey. That's why Thrive's services don't stop there."

"I was going through so many hard times and questioning myself," she said. "I remember their prayers for me to know God's love. It was awesome to see how my perspective changed to see **He is with me.**"

She came back weekly to shop for baby supplies with the "baby bucks" she earned by taking parenting classes. She earned diapers, burp cloths, onesies, books, and a breast pump.

"It was everything I needed," she said. "I'm a single mom with no job or support from the dad. I've had to put school and work on hold. **This is allowing me to be a mom first** and care for my daughter."

Nicole also experienced the essence of the Thrive family by attending our client celebration parties for Mother's Day and Christmas.

"I would describe the events as just an outpouring of love and encouragement from the Thrive community," she said. "It's awesome to share stories with the other moms there in similar circumstances, see the little ones growing up, and see the brighter side of our situations during the holidays."

Nicole needed community as a stay-at-home mom. Her advocate gave her an Embrace Grace box full of spiritual encouragement and an invitation to a weekly support group for single pregnant women and new moms at **Trinity Bible Church**.

"This is exactly what I needed," Nicole said. "I am learning to trust God more. I'm learning my daughter was His blessing to me, and our lives are not a mistake. I'm learning to be a daughter of God in order to be a better mother for Kyle. A year ago, I needed so much support. Now, with God's help, I have this community, and I can give back to these girls in my Embrace Grace group who haven't had their babies yet."

She is looking forward to the future.

"If you support Thrive, thank you for your generous hearts," she said. "Thrive is pretty much amazing. As I reflect on what God has done for me, I am so thankful for the generous and loving people He has placed into my life."

New York abortion law is on your doorstep

New York is far, but ripples of the state's new law allowing late-term abortions have hit our doorstep. A client who was 27 weeks along in her pregnancy met with Earlene Jones, Thrive's Director of Client Services. Since abortion is only legal in Texas through 21 weeks, this client's family offered to pay for her to travel to New York for a late-term termination. Jones shared God's hope with her, and she chose life. Jones connected her with a Thrive partner, the **EQUIP Ministry at Park Cities Presbyterian Church**, to help her with rent and a job search. We are so thankful God has a personal touch that is bigger than any political movement.

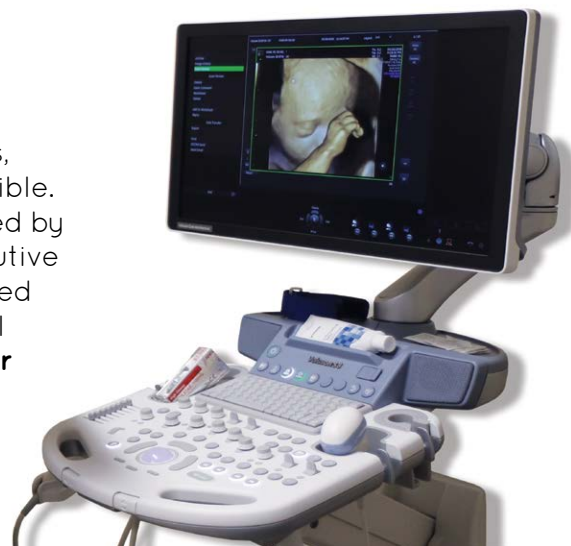

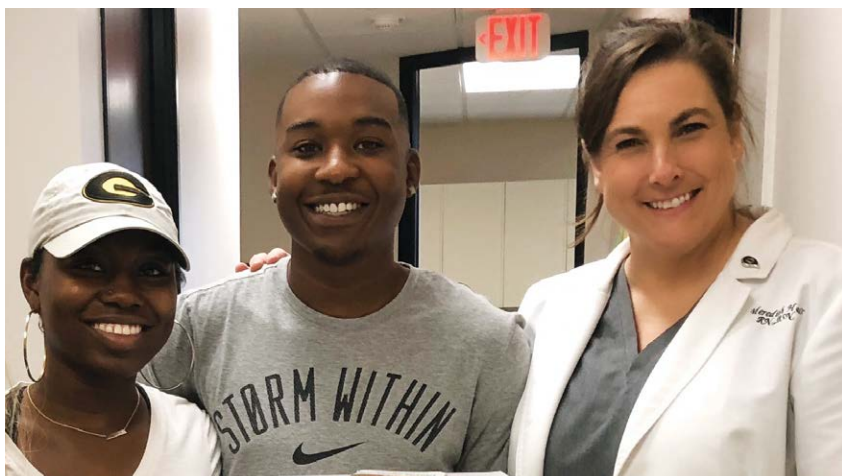

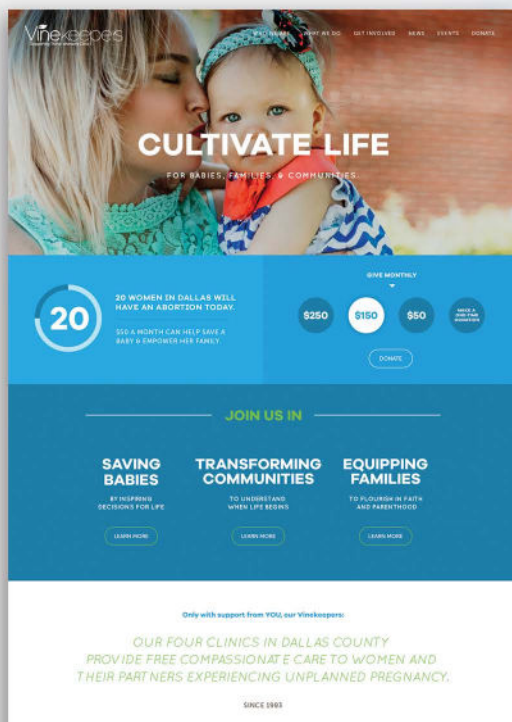
