YOU upheld us through this pandemic!

We have a new theme for 2021 at Thrive – **Anchored in Hope**. It is our focus of the year as our staff serves on the frontlines because we know God is good all the time. It's true isn't it? It is true even with a COVID-19 year when businesses closed, many worked from home, churches moved to online

gatherings, and friends and families only gathered virtually. Some friends and family became ill or even died, but **God is still God and He is still good**.

His hand of blessing has been upon Thrive and we see it in multiple ways. In 2020, we were able to hold 3 of 5 events, and minister to clients face to face. Though we operated at 75% of our normal hours, **210** babies were saved from abortion and another **430** whom we deem as at risk were protected. Yes, babies continued to be saved! At year end, YOU gave generously to enable Thrive to finish well so we began 2021 **in a good position**. Thank you!

Throughout the year many of our volunteers bravely continued to serve—in our offices or remotely mentoring and educating new moms and dads.

We completed the process of becoming a paperless clinic, which was no easy feat! All our client files and most of our education programs are now fully electronic. Progress...even in a pandemic!

You can read our full 2020 annual report in this magazine, but know 2021 is starting strong with a new online outreach approach with Vitae. This first quarter of 2021 has brought us 43% more abortion-minded clients than the first quarter of 2020.

Aren't we all ready to move into the future? This month, our board and key staff are thoughtfully and prayerfully focused on a new 3-year strategic plan for 2021–2023. It will unfold in the months to come.

Thank you for your heart of passion for the unborn and their vulnerable parents. Thank you for standing strong with us and giving generously with prayer support and from your pocketbooks. You are true heroes saving and equipping the next generation. *I*

Thriving through COVID-19 -The pandemic closed clinics for six weeks,

but you ensured our services never stopped. In that time, staff served **800 clients** on the phone or through telehealth appointments, including **206 women considering abortion**. Many chose life!



How is the pandemic framing our future?

We asked three key staff on the frontlines to explain how YOUR support of ongoing innovation is taking us to the next level.

Virtual mentoring proves popular

The pandemic has made us change a lot of things for the better! We transitioned our Earn While You Learn program to virtual classes called Brightcourse. We send a link so clients can take parenting classes on their phones or computers, and then their advocate can mentor with them over the phone. We started that with COVID-19 and will probably continue it. Our advocates have said our clients really enjoy the phone calls and seem to open up more than they did in the office visits. That transition has also opened appointment slots in our physical offices

for us to see more abortionminded clients, and to see them quickly.

We also went paperless this year! Those iPads save us so much time with our client intake and processing so we have more time to spend visiting with them.

Masks won't stop our smiles

We are working hard to protect our pregnant women, who are at higher risk for COVID-19. We are wearing masks, but all of **our** nurses are wearing pins to show clients our smiling faces. We've also had to prevent clients from bringing guests, which can be hard because we want fathers to be affected by what we do. So, in a change of policy, we are allowing fathers to Facetime into the sonogram room so they can be a part of that moment and it makes a difference. We will continue to revisit these policies as things evolve.

Our new sonogram machines are amazing! The latest technology lets us show a client

her baby as early as 5 or 6 weeks. It's their first bonding moment!

I had a client the other day who couldn't afford an abortion. She told me Planned Parenthood is helping her fund her abortion. We are facing new challenges in this era, which shows how important it is for us to continue offering these free services.

Public schools go online. So do we!

COVID-19 hit and teachers in schools everywhere were scrambling. **Thrive decided to make all of our education available virtually**. What does that mean? You get a nurse live on a Zoom or Google Meet teaching fetal development or sexual risk avoidance. We've been teaching this way this entire school year and have taught 2,400 students.

It is very tough to teach online. Students are not as engaged. We have worked hard to find ways to get the kids to respond. One thing that brought the most attention was a microscope video we found showing a light that sparks at the moment a sperm meets and egg. They are amazed and it definitely ignites conversation. After Spring Break, some schools invited us back for face-to-face education, and we are ready!

Your work in Uganda: Africa clinic update

Did you know?

Your support of Thrive Women's Clinic helps the Latter Glory Clinic outside of Kampala, Uganda to provide counseling, abortion alternatives, and other medical services.

You helped fund:

- 2020: a baby delivery table and salaries for the director and assistant director
- 2021: medical supplies needed to deliver babies

What's new:

Zania came to Latter Glory Clinic in 2019 single and seeking an abortion. Clinic Director Cathy Birungi shared the gospel, told her they would help care for the baby through delivery, and brought her into their vocational training and discipleship program. A mission team from the U.S. prayed over Zania and her home. She is now a seamstress, following the Lord, and married to the father of her baby. What a story of God's redemption!

Did you know?

Men play an important role in a woman's decision to choose life, which is why Thrive has a team of dedicated men to minister to these expectant dads. Through counseling, mentorships, and online courses, they cover relevant issues, such as parenting, abortion, adoption, relationships and marriage, sexual integrity, the Christian faith, finances, interview/ career skills, and more. In 2020, our men's program had 145% more mentoring sessions.

What's new:

As part of an Eagle Scout project, sophomore Jacob Vermeulen gathered some friends to remodel our men's counseling room into a man cave where future fathers can feel at home. "I am thrilled to see a long-time dream become a reality at Thrive. This room will enable us to better connect and serve men in crisis pregnancies, while more clearly communicating to these men, 'We see you. We care about you. - Hosting an open house at our clinic so church members can tour, understand the needs, and explore involvement opportunities.
- Educating church youth about the LIFE issue with Thrive's OhKnow presentation.

In turn, Thrive provides a place where the church can send people facing unplanned pregnancy.

Dr. Mayra Thompson shares the pressures she faces as a prolife ObGyn

s a doctor of obstetrics and gynecology for 37 years, I have a first-hand view of the impact of abortion on women's health. From the very beginning, I've had to take a stance that impacted my career.

I graduated from medical school in 1980, a few years after Roe V. Wade legalized abortion in the U.S. Throughout my college years, young men and women were immediately divided. As a Christian, my view on the subject was clear. There was no choice but prolife. My studies in basic biology and embryology in medicine further enhanced and confirmed my belief that the miracle of life begins at conception.

My first serious challenge to my beliefs came at the time of choosing a residency position for training. I was courted by a well-respected program. To my dismay, I was expected to perform abortions in both the first and second trimesters. That means I would be performing abortions up to 26 weeks

after conception. The hospital had a ward just for the second trimester terminations. There was no question in my mind that the program was not for me. But walking away would be a big sacrifice. As a Hispanic female, they courted me with a generous salary. As an immigrant who grew up in a blue-collar family, people would say I was crazy to turn this down. But I couldn't do it. I explained to the program why I could not participate. I was told that my stance would never allow me to be truly successful

in this field.

I am happy to tell you, that has not been the case. I have, however, been challenged and attacked for my views. The argument presented is that if we are against abortion, we are against women. In fact, the opposite is actually the case. I am definitely pro woman, in her entirety. Throughout my career, I have seen the effects of abortion on those women who have had one. The regret and inability to forget that action has often led to depression and unhappiness. Although the "benefits" are always publicized, the problems associated with surgical and medical terminations are downplayed by abortion advocates to the detriment of women.

I have been asked many times if I am afraid of outwardly stating my belief. I have been afraid, however, my personal conviction AND my medical training have both taught me that I must speak the truth. It took

> courage for me to testify in Austin to add medical regulations to abortion clinics in 2017 under House Bill 2. We need your prayers so that we do not cower.

For the past 11 years, my husband and I have financially supported Thrive because those of us in the health profession need a strong pro-life voice in our culture. We need Thrive to speak truth to women who may not be hearing that voice from their own OBGYNs. I know Thrive is making a difference on the frontlines. Will you join me in supporting Thrive Women's Clinic? *e*

"She was like a completely different person with the peace in her spirit," Summey said.

Jenny came back to thank the staff. "Everybody was so kind to me through this whole thing." Jenny said, "I'm truly blessed and so happy to have this baby."
