

Freeman brings rich experience

isa Freeman was a young professional moving up the ranks in a corporate job for a telecom company when something dawned on her.

"Who cares?" she realized. "None of that made a difference. I needed to be doing something more meaningful."

After all, that's how her parents raised her. Her dad worked for the City of Dallas and always knew of someone who needed help.

"We weren't a family of wealth, but I have memories of helping many people in need throughout my childhood," she recalls. "Most I never personally met, but a few were people my parents helped for years. I remember one instance particularly well when we bought a family their Christmas gifts including a bike for their little boy."

Those experiences gave her a passion to serve others, and she needed a job that embraced that part of her upbringing. She pursued a master's degree in counseling, which led her to volunteer at Prestonwood Pregnancy Center in Dallas. She ultimately left her corporate job to become the development director and later, the executive director. After 12 fulfilling years, she left to help care for her mother who had been diagnosed with a terminal illness. God led her to serve in other realms of nonprofit work. Her most recent work has been leading development efforts for a Cuban church outreach ministry as well as serving in various roles with animal rescue groups.

Now, she said God brought her back in the pro-life movement, leading Thrive's four clinics into a new

era of ministry. While abortion laws are changing the game, she believes the goal of the ministry remains the same: inspire decisions for LIFE.

"Women will always have choices no matter the law. Even now, she could drive to an abortion clinic in Oklahoma or order an abortion pill online," she said. "We just need new strategies and ways to meet the needs of these clients and develop that deeper relationship so Thrive is her top choice over Planned Parenthood. We can do so much more for her here. We can empower her and her partner. We need to communicate our availability and desire to get to know them and help them in their personal development."

She loves the relational approach that gives clients the space they need to make the best decision for life.

"There's a balance to this ministry," she said. "We share the Truth in a way that respects a person's autonomy, and then we trust God to do the work we can't do: reach her at a soul level."

Her faith in God's sovereignty is reflected in her favorite verse from the Book of Ecclesiastes: "There is nothing new under the sun."

"I find that comforting when facing difficulties," Freeman said. "Not just difficulties in my own life, but in a world of hard things like political divisions, pandemics, human trafficking, etc. God is still in charge and we just need to trust him and stay adaptable to what he brings us."

She is glad he brought her to Thrive, a ministry she has long-recognized as a leader in pro-life work in the Dallas area.

"It's a privilege to work with such an awesome group of staff, volunteers, and board members to do such meaningful work," she said, noting she loves to foster a spirit of collaboration among all those parties. "I believe people closest to the work have the best insight and solutions. I recognize the expertise of those around me and try to foster an environment where everyone can do their jobs to the best of their ability."

While she will be leading Thrive at an executive level, she has fond memories of the previous pregnancy center counseling rooms where she connected with clients. She keeps in touch with a few of them including one former client, an abuse victim, who is now a successful leader in her chosen career. Another client who was once considering abortion placed her first baby for adoption with Freeman's help, and now she has married and built a family of her own.

She is looking forward to building more redemption stories just like those. 🖉

When Cornerstone Christian Church launched in a high school cafeteria in 2005, the founding members made a remarkable financial commitment. "They wanted to make missions a priority in the DNA of the church from the get-go," said Pastor Ron Key, who has led the church since its first year. "They started giving 50% of all the church money to missions and they haven't stopped."



Thrive was one of the first ministries the church chose to support.

"When we began, not a lot of churches were supporting Thrive," Key said. "That was disappointing to me. The church has a moral responsibility not to just preach against abortion, but to save the lives of the unborn, to help people choose life, help disciple mothers, and help families to raise their kids in a spiritual environment."

His church has used Thrive as a resource for its own members who are experiencing unplanned pregnancy, and Key said his missions committee is confident in Thrive's financial stewardship.

"I can't tell you in words how proud we are of all that's been accomplished at Thrive and what it does. We are just all in."

The church sends some of its own members to serve as volunteers. Priscilla Baitup, a founding member of

Cornerstone, has met with clients at Thrive for 7 years.

When she was a resident advisor in her dorm at the University of North Texas, she remembers struggling to talk the girls in her hall who had abortions. Since then, she has learned how to share the Gospel boldly. After struggling with infertility, she adopted her infant son from a mother who was seeking to avoid her fifth abortion.

"That's part of my story, and I get to share that every Tuesday with clients at Thrive," Baitup said. "I can't imagine a church that wouldn't embrace this ministry."

Texas Heartbeat Law – AN UPDATE

Heart Rate

167 bpm

The Texas Heartbeat Law remains in effect! Since September, this law has banned abortion after a baby's heartbeat is detected, around 6 weeks along.

The Supreme Court is currently considering arguments over this law, and another Mississippi law banning abortion after 15 weeks along. The court's ruling is expected in Summer 2022.

What are we seeing at Thrive? Our clients are experiencing more urgency to get an abortion. Many do not understand that a heartbeat can be detected as soon as 3-4 weeks after their last menstrual period. We are also seeing local organizations helping women fund their travel and procedures out of state.

What are we doing at Thrive? Our client services team has revamped our telephone talking points to help clients understand this new law. When possible, we offer same-day appointments for free sonograms so they can learn more about their timeline and understand their options—including parenting and adoption. We are also working on our Google advertising to reach these clients FIRST.

What can YOU do? Help us equip families. If abortion is no longer an option for most pregnancies, we must plan to encounter more families in DFW who will be welcoming babies they did not plan to have. Those families will need the support of our parenting classes, mentors, and partners who can provide practical resources such as jobs, housing, and childcare. THIS IS WHAT THRIVE DOES! With your help, we are **READY** to meet this need!

Salvation story:

During high school, my older brother and I were invited to Young Life camp in Colorado. I heard the Gospel for the first time on a personal level. They gave us time to sit with Jesus. I was walking under the stars and the mighty wind was blowing me around, which felt like my life at that time. I told Jesus I surrendered my life to him. The wind stopped, and the Lord met me in the stillness.

Why Thrive?

Thrive is a ministry after God's heart. I feel his love for life here, and I'm thankful I get to partner with those who need to feel His comfort, compassion and love for him. Every day I thank Him that I get to serve him in this way.

Why men?

It is vital that men feel the love of God and God's leadership in their lives. As leaders of their homes and families, they need to know that their voice really does impact the world around them and they are never alone. Psalm 128 mentions a fruitful vine and a family grown from a life with the Lord. I imagine these men following Christ, the true vine, and experiencing the legacy of a happy home that scripture promises.

Top ministry moments:

I love the initial introduction when I meet a guy in the lobby as he waits for his partner to have her pregnancy test and sonogram. I get to meet him right where he is and invite him to come talk so we can walk alongside him. In seeing that man's reaction, sometimes just a smile, I can glimpse the restored hope developing inside him.

When I discovered I was pregnant with my first daughter, I had a great job and was doing well for myself. However, I was long addicted to hydrocodone. I was taking enough for an overdose every single day. I had to quit my job to go to rehab and prepare for the baby. I was clean and sober when Isabel was born.

She arrived early. The doctors said she was exhibiting signs of dependency. I tested negative for everything but opinions were being formed about me and CPS got involved. Every parenting class, every hoop they wanted me to jump through—God helped me do it. So, when she came home after 3 months in the NICU, she came home to her mother.

Two years later, I was moody and that led me to start drinking to cope. I had never really been a drinker before. I hadn't had sex in six months, but I started to wonder if I was pregnant. I had no belly so nobody believed it was possible, but I took the pregnancy test and it came back positive—that's why I had been so moody. I immediately stopped drinking.

Grave fear took over me. I was thinking this is my fault. I already robbed this child of a healthy pregnancy. They are going to find alcohol in my system and, not only take this baby, but my other child. This was the lie the devil fed me: You're going to have to abort this baby to keep the child you already have.

The Bible says the devil stands before the Father

and accuses us day and night. Now I know what that scripture means.

I called a lot of abortion clinics. Thrive came up in a Google search. I called thinking it was another abortion clinic. They gave me an appointment right away.

I knew I didn't want to do this. I was raised a Christian and believed murdering babies was wrong, until I faced that decision myself. I was gripped by fear. We make a lot of choices out of fear we wouldn't make otherwise.

I told God, "I know you don't want me to do this. Make a way out."

I met the nurse, and she was filled with the Holy Spirit. There was beauty and love and this glow around her. She was an angel. I didn't know you could make appointments with an angel.

I told her I was looking for a sign from God that I wasn't supposed to abort this baby. She just calmed me so much and prayed and made me feel at peace. She gave me a sonogram and it just drove it all home. She was real. This is my baby.

That's the sign I had asked God for. Even though I thought I was driving to an abortion clinic, He was driving me somewhere else. I changed my mind.

The nurse let me know she was going to be there throughout the process, and she was. She gave me prenatal vitamins and resources to find the right doctors. She called and checked up on me.

The baby—Abigail—came quickly after that. I can't even begin to explain how God ordained it, and all my fears about them finding alcohol went away. I went home with both of my children. I'm clean and sober, and life is good.

Isabel is thriving in kindergarten and Abigail is in PK-3. I am the vice president of the school's parent association. I have such high hopes for them. I really try to teach them about God. I believe if you train up a child in the way she should go, she will not depart from it. My mom gave me that faith when I was a child, and it is the only thing that has helped me transcend the hard things of this world.

I really made the right choice. I couldn't imagine if I had the abortion. It probably would have eaten me alive. I thank God he spared me from that. God is mighty to save.

I want you all to know there are a lot of women out there like me, who don't really want to get an abortion. They've just been deceived, but the Lord has hope for them. Thrive is giving them the courage they need. You are saving lives. Thank you for saving Abigail's life, and for all you've done for us.

The air-conditioning technician spent the afternoon working on the ducts, listening to Thrive staffer, Yuliana, counsel pregnant clients over the phone. (Before he began, he signed the Thrive confidentiality agreement all contractors must complete before working in our in our office or clinic.) He came down from his ladder intrigued and asked many questions about Thrive's work. He then pulled a roll of money out of his pocket and said he wanted to donate \$400 anonymously. He returned another day to continue his work, spent time visiting with Thrive's staff. and pulled out \$4,000 to donate that day. "He was so moved by watching God's work at Thrive," said Helena Isbell, site supervisor. "He said it was his tithe."



Dallas Quintuplets Thriving—thanks to you!

Perhaps you saw Brenda Raymundo on the local news this summer after she gave birth to quintuplets—the first set of five delivered at Parkland Memorial Hospital in seven years.



Since the quints arrived, Brenda has been working with a Thrive mentor to equip herself for motherhood. Through her mentoring and online parenting coursework at Thrive, she earns diapers from Thrive's baby store. (The babies use about 50 a day!)

"She's living a crash course in infant care!" said Jan Cassidy, the longtime Thrive staffer who has weekly phone calls with Brenda. "She is a nice girl doing everything she can to support her

little ones." After facing fears and complications in pregnancy, Brenda said she is at peace with motherhood and truly



appreciates help from Thrive. **"What I appreciate most**

about my time with Jan is that she prays for me," Brenda said. "In all of the programs I've done, nobody has ever prayed for me like that. When some of my babies were still in the NICU struggling with oxygen levels, she prayed for them. Now she prays for me. I especially appreciate her prayers for patience."
